## **Rural Finance closing dates**

Primary producers, small businesses and not for profit organisations across Victoria affected by the devastating floods and storms which commenced in October 2022 can apply for a package of support to help kickstart their recovery effort. This support is also available to primary producers impacted by the hailstorms late in 2022.

The Victorian Primary Producer Flood Recovery Grant of up to \$75,000 is available to support clean-up, relief and recovery. **Closing 4pm, 13 July 2023**.

The Victorian Rural Landholder Grant of up to \$25,000 is available to help rural landholders who have an eligible smaller-scale primary production enterprise with cleanup, relief and recovery. **Closing 4pm, 13 July 2023.** 

The Victorian Primary Producer Flood Recovery Transport Support Program is available to help pay for the transport of emergency fodder or stock drinking water, and moving stock to agistment, sale or slaughter. This program provides a subsidy of up to \$15,000 paid at 50 per cent of the total costs. **Closing 4pm, 13 July 2023**.

Primary producers, small businesses and not-for-profit organisations whose properties have been directly impacted are eligible to apply for a Victorian Primary Producer Flood Recovery Concessional Loan of up to \$250,000 to restore or replace damaged assets, and meet general expenses incurred while the clean-up is underway. **Closing 4pm, 13 July 2023**.

Victorian small businesses and not-for-profit organisations who have been directly impacted by the October 2022 floods are eligible to apply for concessional loans of up to \$250,000 to restore or replace damaged assets, and meet general expenses incurred while the clean-up is underway. **Closing 25 May 2023**.

## Flood recovery and restoration work continues across the Loddon Shire

Since the October 2022 floods, Council has been busy getting its road network open and safe for use.

Over the duration of the flooding, at least 65 roads were closed for various lengths of time. Many other roads were also impacted without being closed.

There are now only two roads – Barraport-Minmindie Road and Billings Road, both near Boort, that remain closed due to inundation.

#### Getting the road network open and safe

In getting roads on our network open and usable again, more than 2,000 tonnes of gravel has been used on 34 locations, with many more roads requiring grading.

To get our roads useable within existing resources, Council's Road Management Plan has been suspended.

This means Council's usual road and footpath maintenance activities have been greatly reduced and we are not able to meet the repair timeframes as per that Plan. As a result, Council has seen an increase in customer requests for maintenance.

It is expected that the Road Management Plan will remain suspended for a further six months. In the meantime, we ask the community to be patient and make sure you travel according to the conditions of the networks and adhere to the warning signs.

#### Capturing the damage

Plenty of work remains in repairing all the damage to our road network.

Council has had a team inspecting roads and capturing the damage in line with the State Government's Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements. This fund is there to help councils to restore its essential infrastructure such as roads after events such as the October floods.

To date the following repairs have been identified:

- 117 culvert repairs or replacements
- 56 floodway repairs
- 1 bridge replacement
- 273 km of gravel road re-sheets
- 47 km of unsealed road shoulders to replace
- 14.25 km of sealed road to be rebuilt

Approximately 95 per cent of the network has been assessed and as the data is reviewed over the coming weeks, the damage tally will grow.

Some damage assessments have been postponed so the impacts from harvest traffic on flood-affected roads is captured.

There has also been a need to reassess some roads as the damage has grown over time as traffic has travelled over them.

To put the situation that Council finds itself into perspective – Council's total road expenditure in the 2022-2023 Budget is \$6.7 million. The estimated repair bill for the flood damage to Council's road assets is approximately \$60 million.

#### **Opportunities for asset improvements**

The assessments are also identifying opportunities for improvements. The Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements rules only allow funding to repair assets to their original condition – it does not cover improvements. Therefore, any road improvement costs must be covered by Council.

A number of assets for potential improvements have been identified, including:

- 45 culverts
- 15 floodways
- 2 km of sealed road
- 1 bridge

The improvement components of these works will be considered for funding through Council's future budgets.

#### Delivery of the works

Council is in the process of developing a Panel of Contractors for the delivery of the works. The Panel of Contractors will be required to provide quotations on packets of work. The entire program is expected to be ongoing until June 2025.

Damaged assets covered by Council's insurance include:

- Bridgewater Caravan Park
- Newbridge Recreation Reserve
- Durham Ox Hall
- Fentons Creek Hall
- Bridgewater Swimming Hole
- Donaldson Park fencing
- Canoe launchers

These are at various stages – with some being assessed and others currently being repaired. Council's insurance agency is working through the details with the relevant community committees and Council staff.

#### Reporting issues with roads

If community members have an issue they would like to report they can contact Council directly. Council takes its responsibility to provide a safe road network seriously and appreciates the community's feedback. # Flood affected business grants closing 7 February

Loddon Shire businesses directly impacted by the October 2022 flood can access a one-off grant of \$5,000 to cover immediate expenses.

Eligible businesses can apply for the grant to cover expenses incurred from flood damage including, for:

- qualified tradespeople to conduct safety inspections and repair premises
- equipment, materials and services needed for clean-up
- removal and disposal of damaged materials or stock
- equipment, stock and materials essential for immediately resuming operations.

## Animal/insect related hazards

- When returning to a flood-affected area watch for rodents, snakes or spiders that may be trapped in your home, shed or garden.
- If you have been bitten by a snake, get immediate medical attention by calling 000.
- If you have been bitten or injured by an animal or insect, seek advice from a doctor.

#### Beat the bite

Mosquitos can breed in floodwaters. If you're travelling through or visiting this region make sure you:

- Cover up wear long, loose-fitting clothing.
- Use mosquito repellents containing picardin or DEET on all exposed skin.
- Limit outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are about.
- Use 'knockdown' fly spray, mosquito coils or plug-in repellent where you gather to sit or eat outdoors.
- Don't forget the kids always check the insect repellent label. On babies, you might need to spray or rub repellent on their clothes instead of their skin. Avoid applying repellent to the hands of babies or young children.
