Anzac Day

On 25 April we paused to remember the sacrifice of men and women who have served or are currently serving our country during wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations.

Despite being required to stay at home, Australians found novel ways to mark this important commemorative day. People in Loddon Shire demonstrated their respect and gratitude on Anzac Day by placing a cut-out poppy on their mailbox. This was an initiative of our tourism team to show solidarity during isolation.

Other ways that people recognised the service and sacrifice of our Anzacs included having people pay their respects on balconies, front gates and driveways at 6am on Anzac Day for #StandTo, in place of attending a dawn service.

Musicians learnt and played the 'Last Post' at home to stand united in music and 'in spirit' in the Music for Mateship campaign.

The Australian War Memorial held a revised Anzac Day service which was televised on the ABC while the Shrine of Remembrance in Melbourne live streamed the Dawn Service taking place behind closed doors in the Sanctuary of the Shrine.

Council response to COVID-19

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Council has worked to manage the impact of coronavirus on our community, customers and staff. It is closely monitoring the evolving situation and following the advice of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), the lead Victorian agency dealing with the outbreak.

While many events and services have been limited, postponed or cancelled in order to slow the spread of the virus, essential services such as rubbish and recycling collections, Meals on Wheels, immunisations and outdoor works continue.

Customer Service staff continue to provide service over the phone, including answering questions and facilitating payments. Community Services keep in regular contact with vulnerable members of the community and wherever possible, adapt services to meet the individual's need.

A dedicated webpage has been set up and provides comprehensive information on which services are impacted by the pandemic. This includes links to important information such as health messages, Stage 3 restrictions and advice and support for business.

Council also established a financial response package to assist residents, businesses and the wider community with the financial impacts of the pandemic.

At the end of April, the State Government amended the Local Government Act 2020 to allow virtual meetings for local councils to carry out their work remotely.

This enables Councillors and Council staff to fulfil their duties while maintaining physical distance requirements, using teleconferencing and live stream technology. This will be implemented at the May Council meeting.

Active Living Census

The results are in! According to the Active Living Census results, the most popular physical activity in the Loddon Shire is walking, followed by swimming, active play (playgrounds) and tennis.

In May 2019 Loddon Campaspe residents were asked to complete the Active Living Census (ALC) – an online and paper-based survey available to all residents in the region aged three years and over. The ALC asked them about their health and wellbeing, and physical activity habits including participation in sport and other physical recreation activities.

The ALC was delivered as part of the Healthy Heart of Victoria; a State Government funded health and wellbeing initiative aimed at improving health outcomes for the Loddon Campaspe region.

24,500 people from across the Loddon Campaspe region completed the 2019 Active Living Census, with 812 Loddon Shire residents taking part, being just over 11% of our population.

The findings of the census will assist the region plan for residents' health and wellbeing needs, such as funding the enhancement of public open spaces and recreation facilities to encourage more people to be more active, more often.

Gaining valuable information on what would help people with healthy eating and active living will support efforts to reduce rates of obesity, chronic disease and high-risk health behaviours.

The census also found that being too busy, having poor health, and cost were some of the main barriers to residents not doing more physical activity. About half of Loddon adults were not meeting fruit consumption guidelines, while almost nine in ten (84.8%) were not eating enough vegetables.

The Healthy Heart of Victoria initiative, in conjunction with Council has installed free outdoor fitness equipment in Wedderburn, Boort and soon to be in Pyramid Hill (currently on hold due to COVID-19). It also installed two water refill stations in Bridgewater and Inglewood in collaboration with Coliban Water.

Pyramid Hill Community Centre Master Plan

The completed Pyramid Hill Community Centre Master Plan and Feasibility Study was presented to Council in April and will now be submitted to Regional Development Victoria.

The project focuses on the existing use of the Pyramid Hill Senior Citizens Centre and identifies opportunities to develop and extend the existing space into a community hub.

The improved space will enable the provision of a range of allied health services, senior citizen and community meeting and activity spaces, learning and library spaces and consulting rooms.

Light up Inglewood Sports Centre

A project to light up Inglewood Sports Centre is well underway with the light towers planned for the Inglewood precinct.

The lighting upgrade project will ensure that the Inglewood football oval floodlighting meets AFL training standards and the netball floodlighting meets Netball Victoria competition standards. Once installed, the improved lighting will provide many benefits to the players using the facility.

The light towers, cages and lights have been ordered and once delivered and installed in Inglewood will be commissioned, ready for football and netball to begin.

This project follows the successful Mitchell Park, lighting upgrade project at Pyramid Hill in 2019.

Economic Development and Tourism

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, many events were cancelled across the Shire and some were postponed to later dates. Some, such as the Giant Pumpkin Challenge were able to adapt by going online to ensure it still ran.

Throughout this crisis, more than 25 operators across the region have taken on the task of offering take-away meals throughout the Loddon Valley. The Coffee Bank in Pyramid Hill is one great example of a business acting fast to adapt to the times, implementing a service window, social distancing measures out the front of the store and creating various take home meals to coincide with their normal takeaway menu.

Many businesses have embraced technology and used their websites to sell products online or increased their use of social media to ensure their survival.

Spotlight on: Red Dog Chillies

A farm at Fernihurst has been transformed from cereal cropping to a chilli and pepper farm that is now the headquarters of successful new agri-venture, Red Dog Chillies.

Run by local couple Jude Hannah and Neville Tonkin, the business has effectively found a niche market to suit the small acreage of their farm and respond to the growing interest in hot, Mexican-style food.

The couple planted their first crop of over 1800 chilli and pepper plants three years ago and began selling fresh chillies, jalapeños, cayenne peppers, habaneros and other varieties.

Soon after, they turned their hand to producing, and in addition to their fresh products, which can be bought in season; they now sell a range of pickled jalapeños, peri peri sauces in three flavours and a handful of dried chilli varieties, all under the newly rebranded Red Dog Chillies label.

The bold new brand is fast developing a cult-like following across the state and the pair are now looking to increase their wholesale and retail offering, including an online store, as demand for their spicy locally grown products continue to rise.

Waste voucher system

Until May 2020, Council continued to offer residents fee free waste disposal once a quarter. From 1 July 2019 to 31 March 2020, the service was used by 2,362 residents with 753m³ of waste, 60m³ recyclables, 259m³ steel and 463m³ of green waste as well as 126 items of white goods and 500 items of e-Waste disposed of across the six Council facilities

In an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19, drumMuster collection has been suspended. Also cash payments have been suspended. Currently EFTPOS is the only payment method accepted for the disposal of waste and recycling material.

In April, Council voted to implement a voucher system to replace the fee free waste disposal days.

This is in response to a number of issues that residents and staff have identified since the program was implemented at the end of 2017.

A voucher system will be more convenient for residents and give them the flexibility to dispose of their waste when they need to.

This will also avoid congestion at the landfills and transfer stations, be more efficient for our staff and ultimately lead to better sorting of waste and recyclables.

The vouchers will be delivered to residents through the annual rates notice process with renters contacting the landlord or property owner to obtain a voucher.

Works update

Defect rectification:

From 1 July 2019 to 31 March 2020, 4,970 defects were rectified, with 99.5% of all defects (4,944 in total) completed before their due date.

Defects include such things as potholes and edge breaks on roads, debris or obstacles on pavements, vandalism or graffiti, damage on signage, issues with vegetation and bridge maintenance.

The main three defects categories dealt with were:

- sealed pavement and surface
- signs and delineation
- vegetation

Fee free waste disposal

The last fee free waste disposal days for residents ahead of the introduction of the Voucher system are scheduled for the following dates:

You may dispose of up to four cubic metres of general domestic waste free of charge. This includes green waste, mixed recyclables, general household waste, E-waste such as television and computer screens, home appliances and electronic items, refrigerators, freezers, microwaves and air conditioners. Charges still apply for tyres, bricks and concrete, and mattresses.

Residents will be required to provide proof of Loddon Shire residency.

Maintenance grading program

From 1 July 2019 to 31 March 2020, 3,009 maintenance grading work actions were completed resulting in 1,470kms of grading and 2,116kms of inspections.

Works snapshot

- Construction of footpaths in Wedderburn and Boort is complete while those in Inglewood and Bridgewater are nearing completion.
- Work has commenced on the bridge at Sloans Road over Bullabul Creek, Inglewood.
- Reseals have been completed.
- Old Inglewood Reservoir safety upgrade works have commenced.

Appin South bridge

Works to replace the Appin South bridge with a new dual-lane structure commenced at the end of March, with construction estimated to take fourteen weeks to complete.

The Appin South bridge, spanning the Loddon River is a major access to the Loddon Valley Highway.

The \$1.179 million Appin South bridge replacement program is supported by \$589,500 from the Federal Government's Bridges Renewal Program and a \$393,000 contribution from Regional Roads Victoria's Fixing Country Roads program.
