

Outdoor dining activates Loddon Shire

Council is working with local hospitality businesses to activate outdoor dining and entertainment across the Shire.

So far a number of sites have been launched in Boort, Pyramid Hill, Wedderburn, Newbridge, Tarnagulla, Logan, Korong Vale and Bridgewater.

Council was successful in securing \$250,000 (ex GST) in funding for the activation of outdoor dining and entertainment as part of the Victorian Government's \$29.5 million Local Councils Outdoor Eating and Entertainment Package.

It enables Council, in partnership with the State Government, to provide stimulus to the

hospitality industry, to help businesses recover from COVID-19.

As part of the project, a local Loddon contractor was sourced to build the picnic benches and planter boxes, while plants have been sourced locally for sites. Keeping as much of Council's spending as local as possible, other local suppliers have been included in the future rollout of the project.

Customer Service Workshop set to inspire businesses

A Customer Service Workshop aimed at local businesses in the Loddon Shire will see operators come away inspired to take action to drive their business forward.

To be held on 16 March, the theme of the workshop is *Visitor Service Mastery: How to deliver excellence and delight every customer post COVID-19*.

Topics to be covered in the workshop include *Your* customer journey, *Your tourism business* and *Your digital* service.

The workshop will be hosted by Institute of Excellence founder Despina Karatzias. Despina has worked within the tourism industry for almost 25 years and has around 20 years of business and digital marketing experience.

Despina said the Customer Service Workshop would be more than just "having a cup of tea and listening to a presentation".

"We really want to leave people inspired – and the workshop includes a lot of context, and research, examples, and interaction," she explained.

"More than anything what businesses can really expect is my promise that they will be come away with simple, actionable strategies to help drive their business forward, including low-cost, affordable initiatives."

Despina said the workshop would particularly focus on the management of the visitor experience.

"The workshop will look at pre, during and post-customer service. This includes how we are performing in terms of customer service when the customer is not in front of us."

Works update

A glance at some of the works around Loddon Shire:

Roads

- Works have started on the reconstruction and widening of two kilometres of Bridgewater Raywood Road (seven kilometres out of Bridgewater). Works are expected to be completed by the end of March.
- The reconstruction and widening of 3.7 kilometres of the Echuca Serpentine Road, three kilometres west of Bendigo Pyramid Road has been completed.

Township street improvements

- Construction is underway on the installation of footpaths in locations across the Shire.
- Works on the installation of kerb and channel and associated works at Lake View and Andrews Street in Boort is expected to get underway in March.
- Works have started on the Heales Street drainage project at Inglewood.
- Works are expected to start in March on new footpaths, kerb and channel, and some underground drainage at High Street in Wedderburn (from near the 24 Karat Café to the police station corner).

Local bridge and culvert construction

- Works to upgrade the barrier rail on the Yorkshire Road bridge over Spring Creek are complete.
- Works have started on culvert replacement on the Seven Months Creek in Kelly Street, Pyramid Hill (near the secondary college).

Tenders

- The tender has been awarded for Council's annual reseal program. Reseal works are anticipated to be completed by the end of April, dependent on weather.
- The tender for the Baileys Road Bridge replacement over Bullock Creek in Derby was to be considered at the Council Meeting on 23 February.
- The Laanecoorie Newbridge Road upgrade is currently out for tender.

Township signs

A number of townships signs have been replaced around the Shire. In total 54 township signs were replaced.

Defect rectification

From 1 July to 31 December 2020, 5,114 defects were rectified, with 97.2 per cent of all defects (4,973 in total) completed before their due date.

Maintenance grading program

From 1 July to 31 December 2020, 1,771 maintenance grading work actions were completed resulting in 1,259.5 kilometres of grading and 1,790 kilometres of inspections.

Inspection summary

From 1 July to 31 December 2020, 468 inspections were completed (3,912 defects raised), with 98.9 per cent of all inspections completed before their due date.

Capital works

From 1 July to 31 December 2020, Council completed:

- 15.3 kilometres of local gravel roads resheets and shoulder resheets
- 3.6 kilometres of local road construction

Caravan park upgrades

Upgrade works at the Wedderburn Pioneer Caravan Park, Pyramid Hill Caravan Park and Boort Lake Holiday Park are underway.

New amenities blocks for all three caravan parks are currently being constructed off site, and are expected to be ready for delivery in May.

On-ground works at the Wedderburn Pioneer Caravan Park are complete, while works at the Pyramid Hill Caravan Park are in progress. On-ground works at the Boort Lakes Holiday Park are expected to commence soon.

Upgrades to the caravan parks include road and drainage works, powerhead upgrades, solar lighting and new amenities blocks.

The Loddon Project update and community survey

Council has made great progress on the Loddon Project. Our Community Reference Group met in February to discuss our Community Vision and will provide recommendations to Council in March.

The next step is the development of the Council Plan, which sets Council's strategic direction for the next four years. It will outline objectives and strategies for achieving the direction along with initiatives for services, infrastructure and amenity to achieve them.

This year Council will also be developing our 10-year Financial Plan and 10-year Asset Plan. These important documents identify what resources Council will have to deliver services, infrastructure and amenity, and any new initiatives identified during the Council Plan's development.

Funded three-year-old kindergarten program for Loddon

Council has welcomed the roll out of Victorian Government funding of three-year-old kindergarten in the Shire.

There are five kindergartens in the Loddon Shire cluster - Boort, Dingee, Pyramid Hill, Wedderburn and Inglewood.

All kindergartens are offering 15 hours of funded kindergarten to three-year-olds in 2021, which is run in combination with the four-year-old programs

Forty-one children are currently enrolled in three-year-old kindergarten across the Shire. The funded program has seen a significant increase in the number of three-year-old enrolments in 2021.

Research shows that two years of kindergarten are better than one and that these benefits last into school years and beyond.

Just like with four-year-old kindergarten, the funded three-year-old kindergarten program is tailored to meet the needs of local children and community.

Community projects update

A snapshot of the many community projects happening around our Shire:

- The \$1.4 million Pyramid Hill Streetscape Revitalisation project is currently undergoing detailed design. The project will include formalising pedestrian networks, landscaping, furniture, seating and other amenities within the civic centre.
- Detailed designs are currently underway for the Donaldson Park Community Hub Redevelopment Project. It is anticipated that the tender for the project will be advertised later this year. The project will replace the facility's three ageing pavilions, providing a new complex that will include male and female changeroom facilities, trainers' and first aid room, function room area, meeting room, office and administration area, and commercial kitchen and kiosk.
- Works on the Inglewood Football and Netball Lighting
 Upgrade are almost complete. Footings have been
 poured with lighting towers to be installed in the coming
 weeks. The project will see the installation of four
 lighting towers at the football oval and four lighting
 towers at the netball courts.
- Construction will begin soon on the installation of a section of path at the Little Lake Boort foreshore. The path, to be constructed at the northern end of the lake, will significantly reduce the number of road crossings required to circumnavigate the lake's walking track.
- Tenders have closed for construction works on new female friendly changerooms to be built at the Bridgewater Recreation Reserve.
- Council has funded the purchase of a new mower for the Serpentine Recreation Reserve (Janiember Park).
 The new mower will help volunteers in maintaining the reserve.

 Stage 2 of the Bridgewater foreshore project is currently undergoing a detailed design. This project involves the construction of a viewing platform, shelter and a continuation of landscaping to support local recreational activity and commercial operations associated with Bridgewater and the local area.

Laanecoorie canoe launching pad complete

The canoe launching pad at Laanecoorie has been

finished, marking the full completion of the Laanecoorie Canoe Trail.

The canoe trail was originally designed by the La Trobe University Outdoor Education students from 2017 to 2018.

The Laanecoorie Canoe Trail complements other canoe

other canoe trails in the Loddon Shire – the Serpentine Creek Canoe Trial and Loddon River Canoe Trail.

Community grants applications open

Applications for Council's Community Grants Scheme are now open until 5pm, Saturday 1 May 2021.

Up to \$10,000 is available for not-for-profit clubs and organisations based in the Loddon Shire to deliver projects that directly benefit residents.

This includes enhancing the provision of activities, facilities or delivery of services to people in our community.

Successful grant applications are funded on a two-to-one basis. This means for every \$2 provided by Council, the successful applicants must contribute a minimum of \$1 towards the cost of the project. Up to 50 per cent of an applicant's contribution can be in-kind.

Last year the scheme allocated over \$187,000 in funding across the Shire, with 33 groups receiving full or partial funding.
