Our Process


The initial Bridgewater on Loddon Community Plan was developed in 2003. In 2021 Bridgewater On Loddon Development Incorporation (BOLD) was formed to manage and maintain the Bridgewater on Loddon Community Plan. A survey was produced to identify the communities priorities and circulated around the district in August 2021, receiving an excellent response.

This revised Community Plan has been produced from information compiled from wide community consultation by way of surveys, meetings and talking to community members.

Community Clubs & Groups are included in this plan, they where invited to identify their priority projects by suppling their strategic plans.

Numerous projects from the initial Bridgewater on Loddon Community Plan have been addressed and completed with this assistance of dedicated community members, local government and state government.

2021 Survey Results



Location

Bridgewater on Loddon is located along the Calder Highway, nestled in a prime agriculture region with the Loddon River dividing the township. Bridgewater is 39km northwest of the Central Victorian regional centre of Bendigo, 170km from the Victorian capital city of Melbourne.



History

Bridgewater was established as a crossing point for diggers enroute to the Inglewood gold diggings. A punt operated a mile below the present bridge and was used as a crossing by Cobb and Co. The Loddon River at this point was later used by diggers to wash their gold when scant water supplies at Inglewood dried up or became silted by mining activity. Chinese settlers established extensive market gardens along the river and supplied surrounding districts with fresh vegetables.

The river was permanently bridged in 1862-63. A brewery was established in the 1860's, and several hotels were in existence by the 1870's. A flour mill was opened in 1873, and in the same year a Railway League was formed and was successful in agitating for an extension of the line from Inglewood. The first train arrived in 1876.

Bridgewater's early development was assisted by proximity to the river, as dairying and a cheese factory supplemented sheep grazing and cereals. By the late 1880's, four cheese and butter factories has been established in the region.

A post office was opened in 1868, a school opened in 1871 and the Mechanics' Institute was opened in 1880.


Several sporting clubs were established, including golf (1921) and tennis (1926). A memorial hall of grand proportions was opened in 1923, serving as a picture theatre and social centre. Reticulated water was laid on by a local Water Works Trust in 1928 and electricity from the State grid was turned on in 1940.

Four steel silos of total capacity 280,000 bushels were built near the railway station in 1963 for holding wheat, barley and oats. The flour mill had silos with a storage capacity of 500,000 bushels in 1970.

In 1972 the Waterwheel vineyard and winery was established next to the Waterwheel flour mill.




Bridgewater Memorial Hall
