## 3: Regional context of noxious weed and pest animal management:

Outline the regional perspective by briefly provide a summary of noxious weed and pest animal management on council managed roadsides in your municipality.

The Loddon Shire is located in northern Victoria and covers approximately 6,694 square kilometers that is predominately broad acre agricultural land.

Loddon Shire is characterized by its flood plain that stretches between the Avoca River, Loddon River and west across towards the Bendigo Creek and up to the Mount Hope Creek leading in to Kow Swamp. The southwestern corner of the Shire is lightly forested with Box Ironbark forests.

The population of Loddon Shire was 7,200 as at the 2015 sense. There are several small villages and 5 small towns these towns are as follows:

- Wedderburn
- Boort
- Pyramid Hill
- Inglewood
- Bridgewater

The Loddon Shire is responsible for approximately 4,600km of road network. Council is dedicated to managing pest plant and an animal infestation on Council managed land and is committed to the early prevention and control of newly identified pest plant and animal species in the Shire.

Through past State Government funding initiatives Council has treated approximately 200 km of roadsides for Regionally Controlled and Regionally Prohibited weeds and established pest animals. Please refer to Table 1 for a list of current target species.

Much of the information required to develop this plan had already been obtained during development of the Weed Management Strategy for the Loddon Shire Council.

## 7: Objectives of the Plan:

Contribute to the Shire's ongoing roadside weed and rabbit management program and complement past investments made by Loddon Shire enabled through State Government initiative funding. Assist with preventing the spread and introduction of invasive plant and animal species across the Shire and the region as a whole.

Loddon Shire Council's overall roadside weed and rabbit management objective is the effective and proactive management of invasive species on Council managed roadsides across the Shire. Investment of funds will be aligned to:

- 1. Supporting community group investment in weed and pest control projects.
  - Works will align with community Landcare projects
- 2. Controlling and preventing the spread of regionally prohibited and regionally controlled weeds and rabbits on municipal roadsides to align with any DEDJTR compliance projects in the Loddon Shire Council.
- 3. Control of regionally controlled weeds, such as Silver leaf nightshade on roadsides with high to very high vegetation quality as per ratepayer's requests and Landcare projects.
- 4. Control of Wheel Cactus
  - o Works will align with community Landcare projects
  - o Works on roadsides with high to very high vegetation quality and
  - o To address customer concerns for the spread of this weed from roadsides to private property.
- 5. Protect identified assets such as significant roadside vegetation under threat from weed invasion or other significant roadside infrastructure.
- 6. Addressing other roadside declared noxious weed infestations of concern to the Shire's community including Restricted Weeds declared under the Catchment and Land Protection Act 1994 (CaLP Act).

### 8: Term of the Plan:

The plan will run for a maximum three year period to 30 June 2026.


